What to Do When Things Don't Go as Planned

Maintain a Calm and Positive Attitude

Children look to adults for guidance, so staying composed and offering reassurance can help them feel more secure.

Adapt and Find a New Approach

If something isn't working, adjust your strategy by simplifying tasks, offering choices, or using different communication methods.

Reflect and Plan Ahead

Once things have settled, take time to think about what happened, identify what could be improved, and involve the child in finding a way forward.

Top Tips

- **Use a Warm and Supportive Approach**
Greet children by name, show genuine interest in their lives, and offer praise for their efforts, not just achievements.
- **Listen and Validate Feelings**
Give pupils time to express themselves and acknowledge their emotions, helping them feel heard and understood.
- **Be Consistent and Reliable**
Clear boundaries, predictable routines, and a calm presence create a sense of security and trust.
- **Adapt to Individual Needs**
Recognise and respond to each child's unique communication style, sensory preferences, and learning needs.
- **Foster a Sense of Belonging**
Encourage friendships, teamwork, and participation in classroom activities to help children feel included and valued.
