Hands-on Heritage

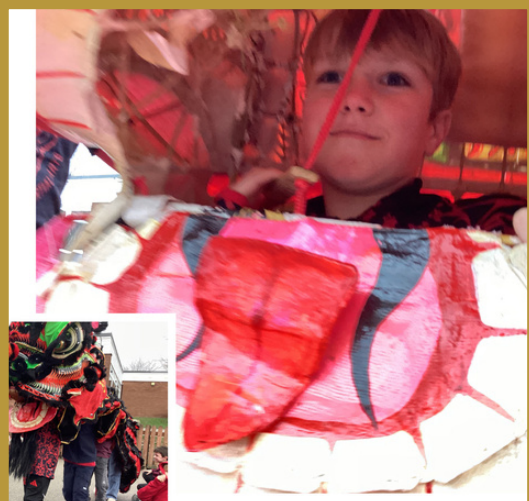

Thank you to everyone who bought a tickets its all going to raise money for the playground equipment.

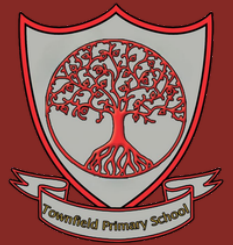

A Quick Note: The RSPCA cannot accept duvets or pillows due to health and safety regulations.

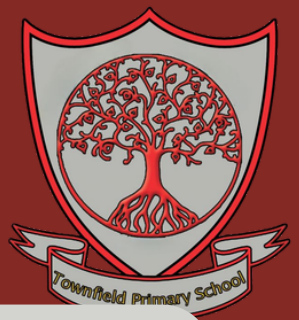

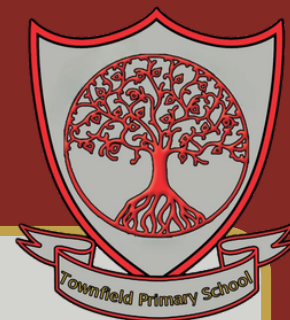


HELLO FROM MISS GRIFFITHS

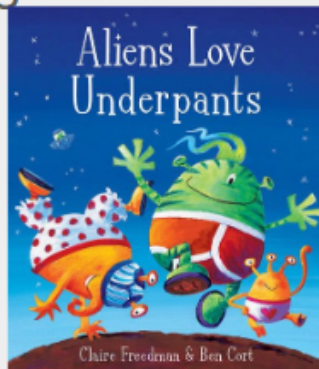

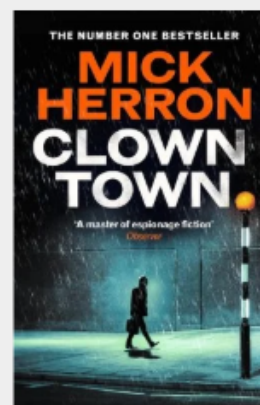

A huge congratulations to all our winners! We are so proud of your hard work and dedication this week.



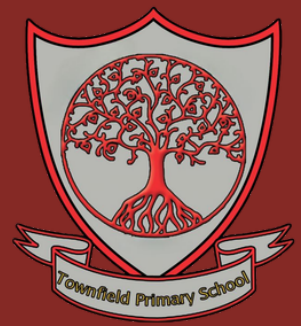

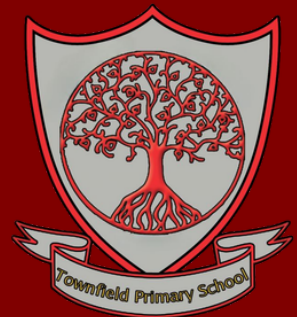

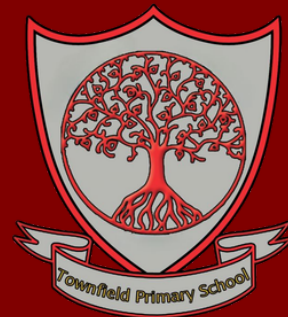
