

Mindfulness

In the Woodland sessions, the children have been having weekly mindfulness activities where they focus on the here and now.

This supports the children in being in a positive mental state where they are ready to focus on what they are learning. It helps children who worry about things that have happened already and/or who are anxious about

things that may happen. All of which are out of their control and can be a barrier to learning.

The key is for children to use it without prompting when they are anxious or upset so we thought it would help if they could practise some of these strategies at home.

This week's focus - Starfish hand meditation

- Close your eyes and breathe deeply.
- Spread your fingers on one hand out like a starfish.
- Take the index finger from your other hand and trace around your fingers and hand. Inhale deeply as you move up a finger and exhale completely as you move down the finger. Concentrate only on how it feels and let other thoughts float away.
- Switch hands and repeat the process, encouraging deep breaths and full exhalations.
- Continue until you feel relaxed and chill.

Ancient Greek Inspired Pots

The children in 3S really enjoyed making their Ancient Greek inspired pots with terracotta clay.

First, they constructed a base, then created coils that they layered on top of each other and secured by scoring the surface of each layer. Next, they painted on 'slip' which is a mixture of clay and water that forms a glue. They then smoothed out the sides of their pots; some children added handles and then used the utensils to add patterns to the clay. Next week, when fully dry, they'll be painted with Ancient Greek pot inspired artwork.



Then had a go at peeling, chopping, slicing and blending. Once we had made our smoothies, we tasted them to see whether our chosen fruits tasted good or not; some of us liked our smoothies but some of us found them a little too sour!

Entries must be submitted on an A4 or A3 piece of paper.


Competition closes on Monday 25th March. Children should give their poster entries to their class teacher.






British Science Week

These are things that people can wear when completing sports to track things such as heart rate, temperature and speed. The children had a go at designing their own wearables and what data it would track.


The workshop will bring the Shang Dynasty to life for the children through an engaging and
